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REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Mayor Coombs called the meeting to order. Philip Smith offered prayer and Mayor Coombs led the chambers in the pledge of allegiance.

City Recorder Hucks called the roll: Mayor Coombs present, Vice Mayor Duncan present, Commissioner Bell present, Commissioner Tinnin present, and Commissioner Young present.

Consider minutes of the March 26, 2015 regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Bell made a motion to approve the minutes of March 26th as written. Commissioner Tinnin seconded the motion and motion passed 5-0.

Susan Young of 213 Marita Avenue expressed appreciation for the Fire Department and EMTs on their response and kind treatment of her neighbors. She then spoke about the deteriorated condition of the property at 302 W. Monticello. She said she had met with Codes and they told her the only violation was tall grass and that the city was cutting it. She claims they had not. She contacted Commissioner Young to get something done about the property. She said she felt citizens should get a response from the city without having to contact elected officials. She said she and her husband were moving out of the area.

Mayor Coombs thanked her for speaking and said he was sensitive to the issues at the property at 302 W. Monticello. He asked City Manager Ellis to follow up on this issue.

City Manager Ellis announced that Amy Murray, Superintendent of Public Works, had achieved certification through the American Public Works Association as a Stormwater Manager through many hours of study and course work. He said she is only one of three people in the State to achieve this, and only a few women in the nation had achieved this certification. He congratulated Amy on her achievements.

Amy Mitchell, Director of Parks and Recreation, informed the Board about the Heritage Days event to be held at Historic Mansker's Station on Friday and Saturday. She said the event was open to school groups and the public and that there were over 24 demonstrators and artists to be onsite.

Mayor Coombs announced that the City's new fire engine was outside on display behind City Hall.

Consider Ordinance No. 15-834, an ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 06-674 as amended, the zoning ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville, by amending language relative to the number of hotel and motel rooms required in the City, second reading and public hearing. Commissioner Young made a motion to

approve Ordinance No. 15-834. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote.

Consider amending Resolution No. 15-623, a resolution to set the amount of a city fee-for-service for residential waste, bulk rubbish and yard waste collection, conveyance and disposal. Commissioner Bell made a motion to amend Resolution No. 15-623 to delay the collection fees for solid waste delivered to the drop-off convenience center until July 1, 2015, to allow drop-off of two garbage bags of trash free of charge per resident per week at the convenience center, and to allow drop-off of recycling and wood waste materials free of charge at the convenience center. Commissioner Tinnin seconded the motion. Vote was then taken and the amendment passed 5-0. Commissioner Bell made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 15-623 as amended. Vice Mayor Duncan seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in 4 votes for “Yes”; 1 vote for “No” by Commissioner Young. Resolution No. 15-623 was adopted as amended.

Consider Resolution No. 15-628, a resolution repealing the expiration date of Resolution No. 14-593 and establishing a new expiration date of April 30, 2016. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to approve Resolution No. 15-628. Commissioner Young seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 6:48 p.m.
