Consider Ordinance 17-889, an ordinance to amend the City of Goodlettsville Municipal Code by creating a new Title II Chapter 3 of the Code entitled Visitors and Tourism Commission, first reading. Vice Mayor Duncan made a motion to approve Ordinance 17-889. Commissioner Young seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote.

Consider Ordinance 17-890, an ordinance to amend the official Zoning Map of Goodlettsville adopted per Ordinance 15-851 to change a property at the intersection of Long Hollow Pike and Jackson Road from Agricultural to CPUDL, Commercial Planned Unit Development Limited and to approve preliminary master development for a commercial center, first reading. Commissioner Bell made a motion to approve Ordinance 17-890. Commissioner Tinnin seconded the motion. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote.
