REGULAR MEETING
GOODLETTSVILLE CITY COMMISSION

Date: September 10, 2020

Present: Jimmy D. Anderson, Harry Bell, Jeff Duncan, Rusty Tinnin, and Zach Young.

Absent: None.

Also Present: Russell Freeman, Tim Ellis, Gary Goodwin, Allison Baker, Julie High, and Addam McCormick.

Mayor Jeff Duncan called the meeting to order. Pastor Tim Stutler offered prayer. Mayor Duncan led the chambers in the pledge of allegiance.

City Recorder Allison Baker called the roll: Mayor Duncan present, Vice Mayor Tinnin present, Commissioner Anderson present, Commissioner Bell present, and Commissioner Young present.

Consider minutes of the August 27, 2020 regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Young made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion and motion passed 5-0.

City Manager Tim Ellis announced the Ministerial Alliance's 9/11 Remembrance Service that will be held on the grounds of City Hall at 7:00pm on September 11th.

Commissioner Jimmy D. Anderson honored the passing of friend, co-worker and retired Fire Fighter, Donald "Duck" Lanius, with a moment of silence.

Commissioner Zach Young acknowledged Pastor Tim Stutler and his church for what his church did early in the pandemic by stepping up and giving money to small businesses in Goodlettsville. He was proud to see our community step up to help other members of the community and wanted to thank him and his church.

Consider old business.

Consider Ordinance 20-975, an ordinance to amend Ordinance 06-674 as amended, the zoning ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville, to remove the Auto Servicing and Vehicular Craft and Related Equipment Sales Uses from the permitted uses of the Commercial Services Limited and Commercial Planned Unit Development Zoning Districts, second reading and public hearing. Vice Mayor Tinnin made a motion to consider Ordinance 20-975. Commissioner Bell seconded the motion. The public hearing was opened. With no speaking in favor or against the proposed amendment, the public hearing was declared closed. Vote was then taken which resulted in a 5-0 vote to amend Ordinance 20-975.

Consider new business.

Consider Ordinance 20-977, an ordinance of the City of Goodlettsville, Tennessee amending the fiscal year 2020-2021 budget, passed by Ordinance 20-970, first reading. City Manager Ellis stated this is replacing a police vehicle that was totaled. Insurance proceeds will total \$19,346.32

and due to depreciation, that will not cover a new vehicle so \$13,324.21 will come from the Fleet Fund to make up the difference.

With no further business, Commissioner Anderson made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Young seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at approximately 6:37 p.m. with a 5-0 vote.
